PROCLAMATION
BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, a national day of prayer has been part of our country's heritage since it was declared by the First Continental Congress in 1775; and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress, by Public Law 100-307, as amended, affirms that it is essential for us as a nation to pray; and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States is directed to set aside and proclaim the first Thursday in May each year as the National Day of Prayer; and

WHEREAS, leaders of our nation have relied upon the power of prayer throughout America's history asking God for divine guidance, protection, and wisdom; and

WHEREAS, we as citizens of this country value our religious freedoms and are thankful for the opportunity to unite in prayer; and

WHEREAS, we join with fellow Tennesseans regardless of religion or denomination to ask God for His blessing and protection upon every resident of our state; and

WHEREAS, this year's National Day of Prayer theme, "Glorify God Among the Nations, Seeking Him in All Generations" is based on 1 Chronicles 16:24, "Tell of His glory among the nations, His wonderful deeds among all the peoples;"

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim May 7, 2026 as

Tennessee's Day of Prayer

and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
